


By 2031 the population of the UK will have grown to 67 million

in 2003 the figure was 20%




by 2031 it's predicted to be 17%

49% of 8-17 year olds are signed up to a social networking site






In 2008, 51% of young people were the ViCtim of a crime...





The number of text messages sent and received every day exceeds the total population of the planet






Children who have never held a textbook will soon hold the world




Children aged 5-16 spend an average of almost 6 hours a day


