## **Assembly Election**

- Labour Administration 30 seats
- Leighton Andrews Minister
- Jeff Cuthbert Deputy Minister
- Labour minority administration



## New Assembly Powers

- Referendum
  - 63.5% in favour
  - 35.4% turnout
- Powers to pass legislation without gaining assent of Westminster Parliament in 20 devolved areas including education



## Transformation Programme

- Intention to transform for the better 16-19 education in Wales
- Called for proposals from all Welsh LEA's and Further Education Colleges
- Gave no specific direction to LEA's or Colleges



### **Examples of Transformation**

- Formal mergers between colleges
- Formal regional configuration of colleges and universities
- Tertiary System
- Formal linking of LEA's to provide a single service



### Formal Mergers between Colleges

- Two types:
  - Type A: both college corporations dissolve and a new merged corporation is set up
  - Type B: One College Corporation is dissolved and taken over by the other.

- Coleg Harlech/WEA (N) and WEA South planned 1 Aug 2012 - Type A
- Coleg Menai and Coleg Llandrillo (discussions) No Date, possibly April 2012?
- Coleg Morgannwg and Ystrad Mynach College (discussions) - No Date, possibly Aug 2012?

- 21 Further Education Colleges
- 170 School Six Forms
- 80+ Training Providers
- 12 Universities

- 8-12 Further Education Colleges?
- c100 School Six Forms?

- 6 Universities (plus Open University and University of Wales)?

## Tertiary System

- Either a system shared between schools and a college e.g. Cardiff
- Or a Tertiary College e.g. Ebbw Vale and Merthyr Tydfil



#### Review of F.E. Governance

- Concept of ownership of a college by its users and stakeholders
- Concept of a Social Enterprise
- Board of Directors (6-12 members)
- Membership Body (25-50 members)



#### Review of F.E. Governance

- Report out for consultation
- Main proposals likely to be accepted
- The devil is in the detail
- Timing with mergers issue



## Review of Structure of Education in Wales

- Main proposals concern LEA's
- Unacceptable PISA results to be improved
- Colleges to remain independent
- F.E. to reduce to 8-12 Corporate entities
- Strong Regional Drive



### 14-19 Education Measure

 Introduced a duty on all schools and colleges to offer a minimum of 30 courses to include a minimum of 5 vocational courses to all pupils/students at 14 and 16.



## F.E. Funding in Wales

- Overall reduction of 1.4% in FE in 2011/12
- Total core funding £303.2m (1.6% reduction)
- Intend to give 2.5% increase in 2012/13 and 1% increase in 2013/14
- Continuation of funding for Pathways to Apprenticeship (£8.5m) and Adult Skills (£17.1m)
- Welsh Government priorities health, schools and skills



#### Minister's Priorities

- Promote progression through learning into employment
- Maintain volume of learning
- Continue to raise standards
- Improve Welsh PISA results 5 places
- Welsh Medium Vocational Provision
- Continue merger and collaboration programme
