The main purposes of the project . . .

to trial Activexpression response devices across a variety of learning contexts and environments

to provide research opportunities for MMU colleagues that might impact on "assessment for learning" practices

to build a bridge between research activity and education practice through enterprise partnerships (Promethean and LEB)

The AID4A Project

- PCE secured 400 devices + small amount of funding + training and support
- 12 research projects across the university . . .
 - One-year projects (Sept 08 Aug 09)
 - Variety of contexts and environments:
 - ITT (Secondary, Primary and Post-compulsory)
 - Humanities
 - Law
 - Science and Engineering
 - Biological Sciences
 - Business
 - Library
 - CeLT
 - ICTS

Some AE uses

- Paired and group work; stimulus for discussion (a before and after approach sometimes used)
- Student texting . . . tutor checking for:
 - existing knowledge/understanding/confidence
 - formative understanding (some ad hoc usage)
 - identifying where individual help is needed
 - effectiveness of teaching
- Texting and various MCQs; tutors "hearing" all students' voices and saving results for future differentiated provision (reinforcement and enrichment)
- Fieldwork, small seminars, groups of students ranging from 10-300+

Some Findings

- Tutor training needs have been minimal;
- Early emergence of a genuine community of practitioners;
- Learner responses have been overwhelmingly positive;
- Assessing individual learners, regardless of numbers, "... takes on a new dimension";
- AE stands up to the "400 test" and the weather!
- Dongles and bags have created some interesting situations!!
- Considerable numbers of tutors outside the projects are engaging with the devices.
