

Rate of increase climbed with the recession


PG population currently growing faster than UG population






What do Masters graduates do?

Six months after graduating

- 72.8% were working in the UK
- 8.4% were in further study in the UK
- 3.6% had gone overseas to work or study
- 6% were unemployed



What were last year's Masters students doing after graduation?



The work Masters graduates do

Of the 26,265 UK Masters graduates from 2008 who are known to have been working in the UK six months after graduating

- 5,240 went into management
- 3,070 went into jobs in education
- 2,245 went into jobs in business and finance
- 2,220 went into jobs in health
- 1,850 went into social and welfare roles



The future

- Graduate employment market seems to be improving
- PG numbers will probably rise and then level off in next couple of years
- Unemployment rates for PG may be elevated for 3-4 years
- New finance regimes for UG students will have consequences for PG, that are not yet charted
- Will interest in PG qualifications be sustained?
