Sycamore Tree is a programme focussing on raising Victim Awareness and teaching the principles and application of Restorative Justice.

So What happens?

The Sycamore Tree programme involves talks, DVD clips, drama and large and small group discussions. During the programme, offenders are introduced to a real-life victim who will share their own story of crime. At the end of the programme, learners are encouraged to make a 'symbolic act of restitution' as a first step towards making amends.

How does it work?

Sycamore Tree is run by trained Prison Fellowship volunteers and consists of six sessions which are:

- Restorative Justice What's that? Introducing Restorative Justice, telling the story of Zac
- Taking Responsibility. The impact of crime on victims, offenders and the community
- Saying Sorry Showing you are sorry. Listening to victim's stories
- Reconciliation. What is the benefit to offenders, victims and the community?
- Taking the next step. Planning what to do

In 2009 Sheffield Hallam University undertook a review of the effectiveness of Sycamore Tree based on 5000 psychometric questionnaires completed by learners before and after the

Some key findings were:

- Across the whole sample of prisoners there were significant positive attitudinal changes
- Statistical analysis indicates that these changes are associated with completion of the programme
- The positive changes are associated with all groups of prisoners including male, female, adult and young prisoners
- The positive changes are also evidenced across all institutional categories



Accreditation



Prison Fellowship is a NOCN Approved Centre. Staff and volunteers receive training in tutoring and assessing to OCN ER requirements.



<u>Sycamore Tree</u> – a 6-session in-prison course, accredited by OCN ER, runs at Levels One and Two (3 credits). The course title is: "Taking Responsibility for Personal Actions"
