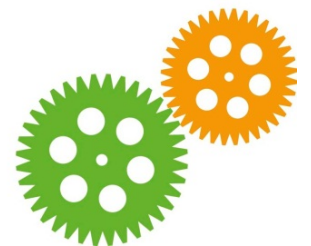

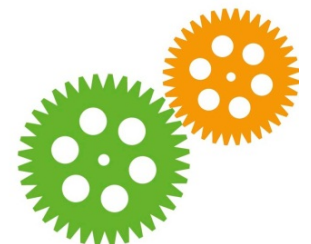

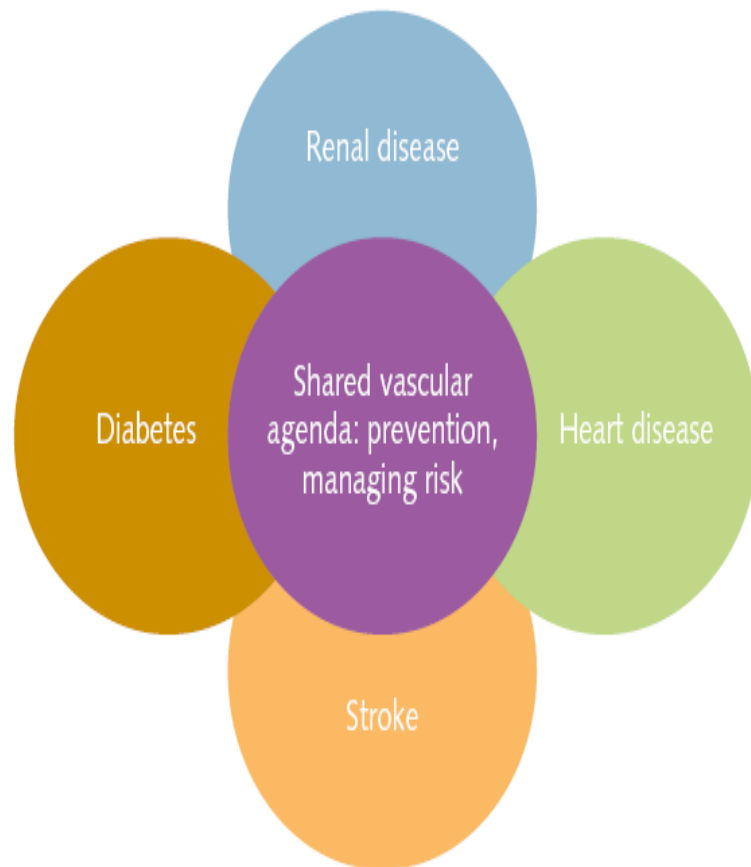
Putting Prevention First



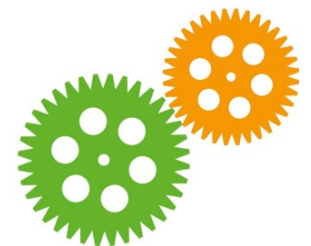
- Policy proposal published 1st April 2008
- 170,000 (36%) deaths caused by vascular disease in England
- Responsible for 20% of hospital admissions
- Largest single cause of long term illness
- Prevalence falls disproportionately in people living in deprived circumstances and certain ethnic groups



Why Develop the NHS Check Programme?



- 40% reduction in CVD mortality since 1996 in under 75s
- Now require investment in prevention
- Shared risk factor profiles
- Evidence suggests that early identification and management of modifiable risks factors can prevent or delay the onset of disease





NHS Health Check programme

Key:

BP: blood pressure

CKD: chronic kidney disease

DM: diabetes mellitus

eGFR: estimated glomerular filtration rate

IFG: Impaired fasting glucose

IGT: Impaired glucose tolerance

Initially, PCTs decide which people to call first and where the checks can be accessed (e.g. general practice, pharmacy etc), bearing in mind the need to tackle health inequalities

~1,185,000 offered to date in 12/13

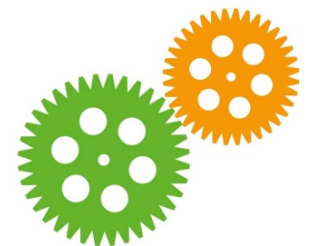

~566, 193 taken up to date in 12/13

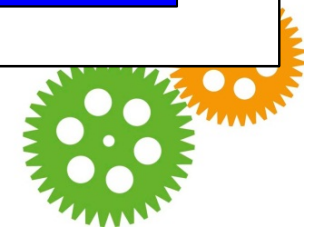
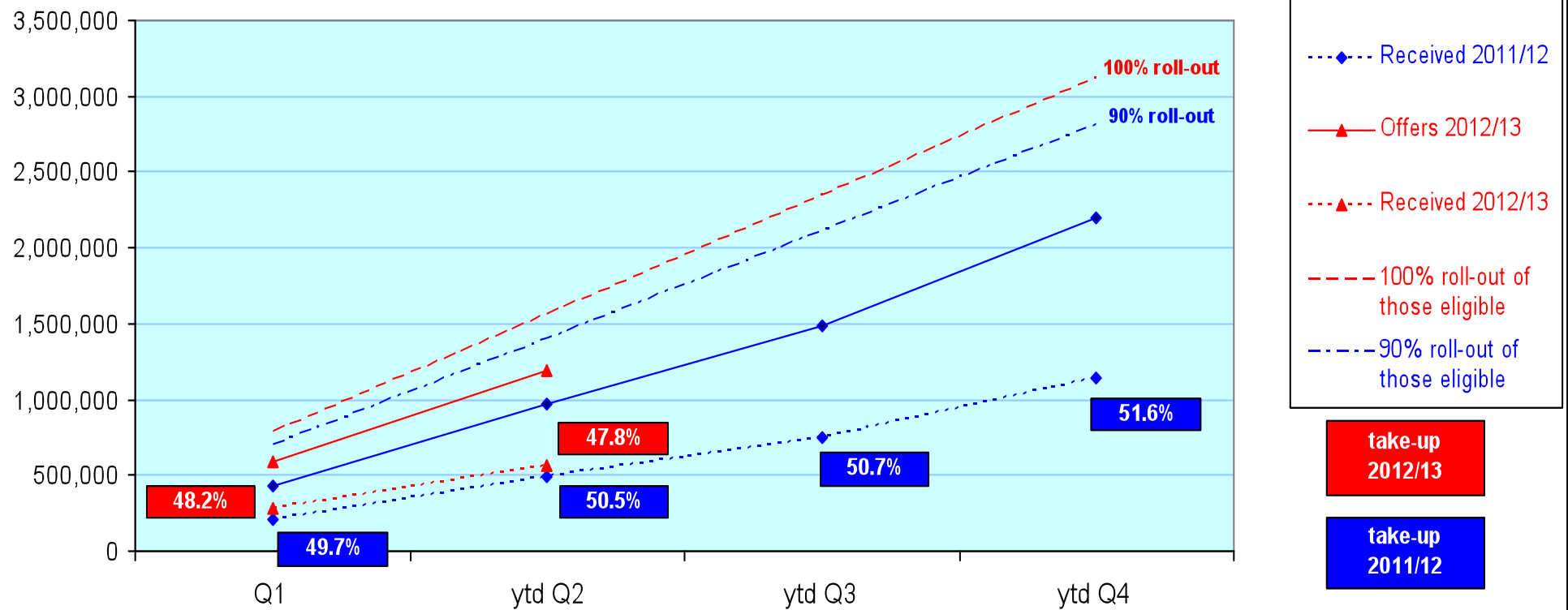
~282, 882 taken up in Q2

~48% take up rate in Q2 12/13

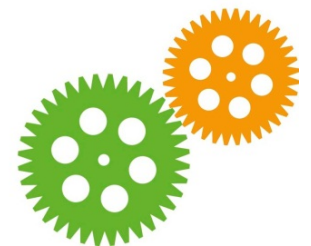


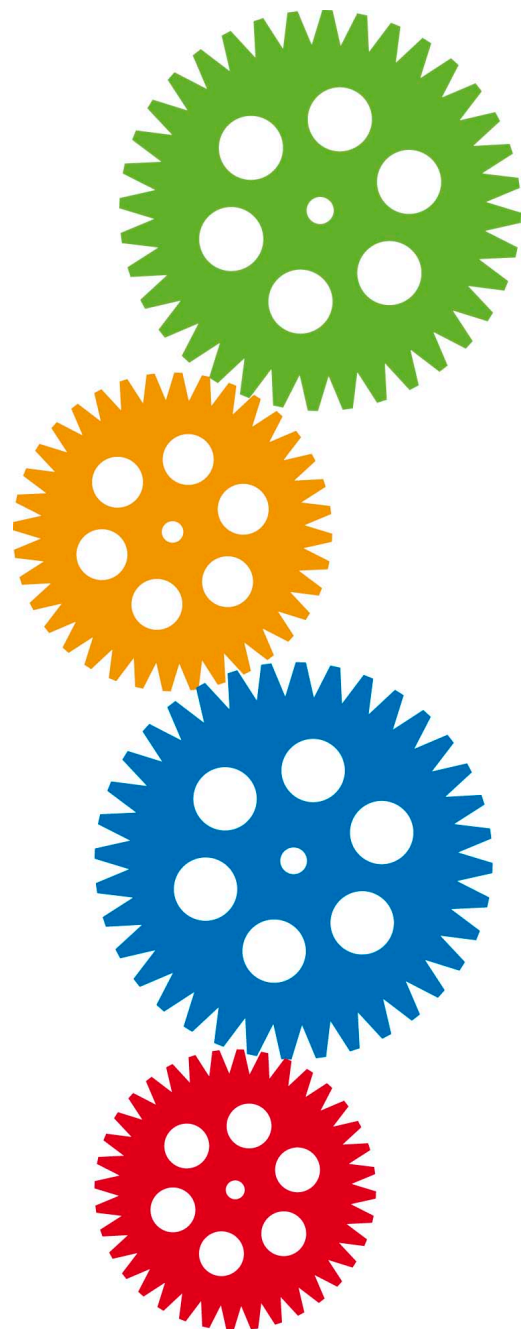
NHS Health Checks offered & received (cumulative); and take-up



The programme from April 2013

- Included in the mandated function for local authorities
- Regulations will require LAs to commission the risk assessment component of the programme
- Included in the Public Health Outcomes Framework
 - 20% of the eligible population invited each year
 - Year on year improvement on uptake
- Contracts will have to sit with the LA and be procured like other LA services (LES will no longer exist)



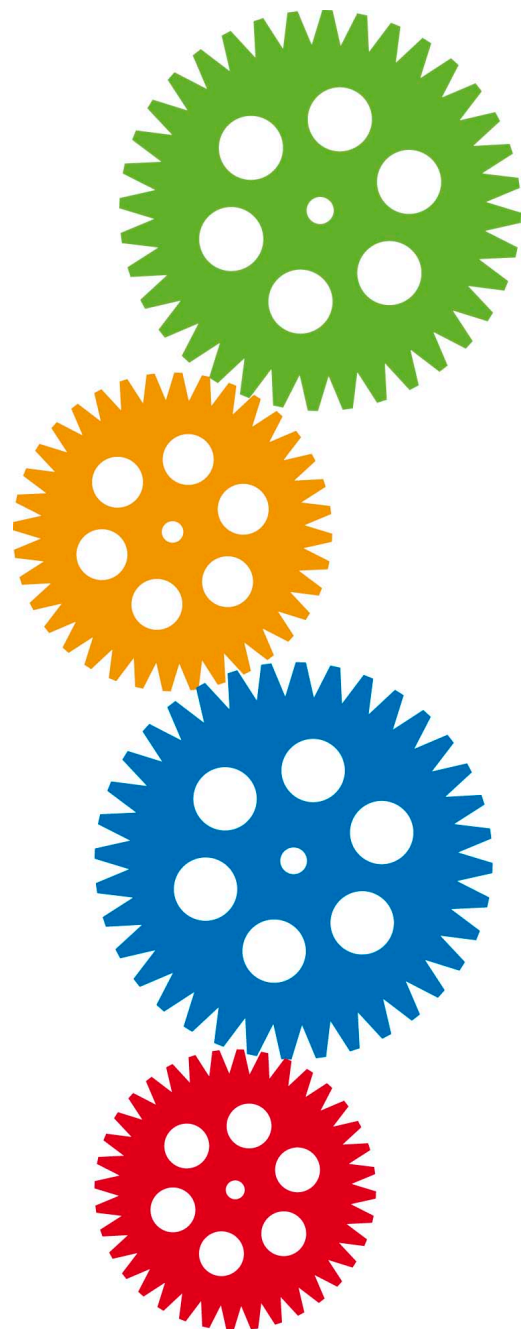

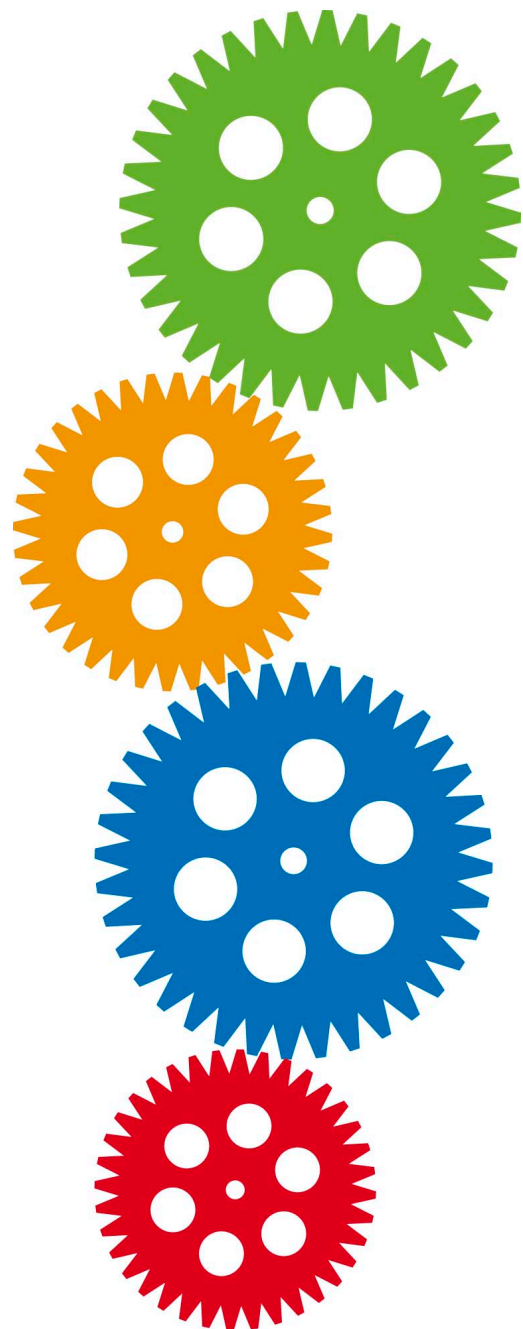
About the NHS Health Check
