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### HE in FE – a few key facts



- Over 257 FE colleges teach undergraduate and postgraduate degrees
- 8% colleges with over 1,000 students
- 170,000+ students study HE in FE (1 in 12 of total HE population)
- Half of all Foundation Degree students are taught in colleges
- 67% of colleges teach Foundation Degrees
- 22.9% of full-time first degree students at colleges were from low participation neighbourhoods (over double the rate of English Universities at 10.5%)
- Majority work in partnership with a University franchise and/or validation

# HE in FE challenges



- Impact of changes to student loans and student numbers
- Government focus on migration numbers and HTS
- Small numbers and franchise arrangements affect KIS
- Competition growing with HEIs and private providers/schools entering the market
- Getting the message over on quality, price, support and outcomes
- Tracking progression and promoting it effectively
- HE 'experience' especially for F/T students (only 4% of total FE college students)
- Higher fees equates to higher student expectations
- Introduction of 24+ Loans for non-proscribed HE

# Myth-busting and distinctive features



- Good feedback from IQER process
- NSS shows student satisfaction with assessment/feedback and academic support higher in FE than HE
- Normally lower staff/student ratios than many HEIs
- Many staff undertake scholarly activity, higher degrees and their own research
- Excellent facilities for vocational study
- Employer responsive and supported (60% saw benefit in association in MEG/157 study)
- High levels of progression into employment(?)/higher study

## HE in FE – USP



- Locally accessible, vocational and skills based, sometimes niche specialisms
- Reaches the parts that others don't i.e. WP
- Colleges provide 33% of entrants to HE in-built market
- Flexible and blended learning may challenge the full/part-time distinction
- Role of colleges in higher apprenticeships
- Links with LEPs and other strategic bodies looking to higher level skills for economic growth
- Employer links and benefits
